It will not stop all flu viruses and the level of protection may vary but if you do get flu after vaccination, it's likely to be milder and shorter-lived than it would otherwise have been.

ONLINE ACCESS

More appointments are now available to book on line. These currently include minor illness, smear tests, blood pressure checks, NHS health checks, shingles vaccination, blood tests and flu vaccinations for those aged 65 or over.

To sign up to online access full details are available on our website or please ask at reception. This service is currently only available for over 18s.

PROXY ONLINE ACCESS

Proxy Access is where someone is given access to another person's online medical record to help them book appointments or order medication. For example:

- A carer for a patient over the age of 18
- A family member for a patient over the age of 18
- A friend of a patient over the age of 18

The proxy does not have to be a registered patient at the same practice, but must be registered for online services on the GP system and always use their own login credentials.

To be given proxy access, a patient's representative must have the informed consent of the patient or, in cases where the patient does not have capacity to consent, the GP has decided that it is in the best interests of the patient for them to have proxy access. Please ask at reception for more information.
